There is some ongoing and fantastic work going into our school priorities of Mathematics and School Routines and behaviours. School council are responsible for checking on this progress and we look forward to showing off what has been done.

Attendance

As stated in previous editions of the newsletter, school attendance is a statewide improvement initiative. If a child has 20 days off in a year that equates to one day per fortnight and contributes to a massive decrease in learning retention and ability.

Research also shows it effects their interaction with their peers and classmates. Currently our school is sitting on 92.46% attendance rate with our target being 95%. This probably has much to do with the last COVID outbreak so we should see a rise in this percentage as it is significantly higher than this time last year. Keep up the great work.
